### PILGRIMAGE OPTIONS AND DESCRIPTIONS

**Full Pilgrimage Walk and Canoe** - Costs include meals, water, canoes provided, transportation of belongings to campsites, camping fees, transportation to evening campsites during Pilgrimage if needed, and end of pilgrimage transportation back to Sanford. Pilgrims must provide their own personal items, **TENTS**, special diet foods and special diet drinks. **Costs**: \$450.00 per adult / \$380.00 per child (10-15 years)

Full Pilgrimage Walk Only - Costs include the above (minus canoes): \$350 per adult / \$270 per child (10-15 yrs)

Day Walker - Meals included (No camping): \$35.00 per day

Weekend Only (Friday dinner - Sunday lunch) - Campsite at St. Augustine KOA, 525 West Pope Road, St. Augustine, FL 32080. Three and five man cabins. Personal tents also allowed. Community bathrooms and showers. Weekend Cost: \$75 per person plus \$175 per cabin (divided by number staying in cabin), or \$75 per person plus \$30 per person per tent.

\*\*\*Family reduced rates apply to four persons minimum. Call for family discounts or custom rates.

### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

### Pascua Florida Pilgrimage<sup>TM</sup> APRIL 2-7, 2024

**PILGRIMAGE PARTICIPANTS**: This pilgrimage is designed for faithful of the Society of St. Pius X. St. Thomas More Priory reserves the right to accept or reject any person as a pilgrimage participant and to expel from the pilgrimage any participant whose conduct is deemed incompatible with the group's interests. Modesty in dress is required. Minors under 18 must be accompanied by a parent. Children under 10 may only participate in the walking sections and must be accompanied by a parent. If children must leave the pilgrimage and be taken to camp early, parents must accompany.

**RESERVATION AND PAYMENT**: 50% deposit and completed registration is required by March 2, 2024 to hold space on this pilgrimage. The balance of the full payment is due by March 17, 2024. The late fee is \$75. Space for this pilgrimage is limited.

**CANCELLATION PENALTIES**: All cancellations requested by participants must be in writing. If cancellation is received after March, 2, 2024, the deposit will be retained.

**PILGRIMAGE CANCELLATION**: If the pilgrimage is cancelled before March 17, 2024, for lack of participants, it will refund all monies paid for the scheduled pilgrimage. In the event of extreme weather preventing both canoeing and walking, the pilgrimage may be canceled early and partial refund will be given.

**PILGRIMAGE SCHEDULE**: The itineraries depend mainly on weather conditions. If these conditions cause cancellation of canoe trips, alternate walks will be substituted.

### **CAMPING AND CABIN INFORMATION**

Camping fees for campgrounds are included, but <u>EACH PERSON MUST PROVIDE HIS/HER OWN TENT AND SLEEPING/BEDDING GEAR</u>. Each person must be able to set up the tent and bedding alone or with the <u>help of a companion</u>. Friday and Saturday nights all participants will stay in camping cabins to the maximum extent, or in their personal tents if they choose. Cabins are for three or five persons. Organizers will assign cabins and try to accommodate families or groups as roommates.

PHYSICAL HEALTH: Participants will take full responsibility for being fully able to participate in the daily scheduled activities of the pilgrimage. This pilgrimage REQUIRES PILGRIMS BE ABLE TO WALK UP TO 23 MILES ON SOME DAYS AND A COMBINATION OF CANOE AND WALK ON OTHER DASY AS LISTED ON PAGE 12. THIS ITINERARY IS FOR 6 CONSECUTIVE DAYS. One may choose not to participate in parts of the pilgrimage, however, there is no refund for missed parts. There is limited ability to transport pilgrims from one camping site to the next.

**CANOE RESTRICTIONS**: In order to be allowed to canoe one:

- Must be able to follow verbal and/or visual instructions.
- Must be 10 years or older and accompanied by parent if under 18 years.
- Must not exceed the manufacturer's limit for the vessel which is the combined weight of all participants in the boating party with gear: Canoes 780 lb.; Kayak Solo 195 lb.; Kayak Tandem 475 lb.
- Must be able to swim and wear a properly fitted personal flotation device (PFD).
- Must be able to enter and exit the canoe/kayak independently or with the assistance of a companion.
- Must be able to remain seated, maneuver, and balance independently or with the assistance of a companion in a canoe or a double kayak, and move the canoe/kayak through the water in a stable manner.
- Must be able to get out from under the watercraft independently and be able to right oneself and remain face up in the water with the aid of a PFD in the event of a capsize.

Participation in boating activities may be dangerous. St. Thomas More Priory reserves the right to deny

persons participation in this event if they are unable to follow the rules. Boating supervisor will assign each person to a vessel. Maximum capacity - Canoes for two to three persons, kayaks one or two depending on individual vessels. All occupants must wear their PFD. Provided whistles must be aboard canoes & kayaks.

**OTHER WATER CAUTIONS**: State law prohibits the feeding of alligators. Intentional capsizing or swamping is prohibited. Do not stay on the water in the event of thunder or lightning. Please be sure to carry drinking water and bug spray. If your vessel capsizes or swamps, it will continue to float. Hold on to the vessel as you make your way to shore.

**PRIMITIVE/ROAD/BIKE PATH WALKS**: Primitive walk areas and paved paths have limited access to bathrooms. Be sure every morning to review the scheduled bathroom breaks. Please advise your group leader if you need assistance or transportation to the next camp site. Walking may be uneven up or down slopes, on primitive nature trails, and, at times, on sidewalks and terrain. Pilgrims will walk on side/shoulder of road against the flow of traffic on the left side of the road. A pedestrian shall obey applicable traffic laws where sidewalks are provided, and to the extent possible pilgrims will use these and will not walk in the street where sidewalks are not provided.

**REQUIRED SUPPLIES: SUN HAT, SUNSCREEN**, proper foot gear, wet wipes, rain gear, first aid kit with bandages and treatment for blisters and wounds, mole skin and items needed for personal health and safety, small flashlight, tent and sleeping/bedding and overnight gear

**SUGGESTED SUPPLIES AND PRECAUTIONS**: snacks, insect repellent, sunglasses. Wear two layers of socks—a good hiking sock on the outside, and a thin polypropylene or silk/nylon sock on the inside. Instead of rubbing against your skin, the socks will rub against each other. Avoid cotton socks for when damp they abrade feet. If feeling a hot spot or a blister coming on, treat it immediately. Cover it with a piece of moleskin (found in the foot care section of most drugstores) and apply a small piece of duct tape over the moleskin to keep it water and sweat proof.

**ADDITIONAL CAUTION**: Central Florida is known as the lightning capital of the world. If you are caught out in the open during a storm, attempt to reach cover as quickly as possible.

**ANIMALS**: Do not interact with or feed the wildlife. Do not pick or disturb plants. These laws are for your safety and the safety of Florida's plants and wildlife. Store food in locked containers and dispose of trash properly.

**BAGGAGE/GEAR**: A vehicle will transport overnight baggage to the next site. All baggage must be waterproof and be labelled with pilgrim's name. Each morning pack overnight belongings and check that identification tags are attached. Place baggage in your assigned transport vehicle.

**RESPONSIBILITY & LIABILITY:** Participant agrees to sign additional waivers that may be required. St. Thomas More Priory acts only as an agent for the various independent suppliers that provide campsites, cabins, transportation, activities, or other services connected with this pilgrimage. Such services are subject to the terms and conditions of those suppliers. St. Thomas More Priory and their respective employees, agents, representatives, and assignees accept no liability whatsoever for any injury, damage, loss, accident, delay, or any other incident which may be caused by the negligence, defect, or default of any company or person in performing these services. Responsibility is not accepted for ANY losses, injury, damages or expenses of any kind, INCLUDING THOSE due to sickness, mental disorders, weather, strikes, hostilities, wars, terrorist acts, acts of nature, local laws, or other such cause.
