- The blessing of religious items takes place on the last Sunday of the month. Please place items in the Sacristy before Mass.
- As you know, Fr. Fullerton has asked us to say the Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus for the intention of the upcoming elections and the good of our country. Copies of that Novena are provided on the cards in the vestibule. We will also have an overnight adoration the weekend before Election Day for the same intentions and for the defeat of Amendment 4 in Florida. **Adoration will begin after 9 am Mass on Saturday, November 2 and will continue all day and overnight until Sunday morning, November 3.** Adoration will conclude with Benediction at 7:30 am on Sunday at the time we would normally say the rosary. We will need volunteers for one-hour shifts through this time (taking more than one shift is welcome). We need to have at least two volunteers for each hour, and gentlemen are encouraged to take the overnight hours (for obvious reasons). The door of the chapel will be locked overnight. When coming to the chapel for a shift, volunteers should tap on the chapel window, one volunteer in the chapel should open the window to verify who is asking to come in and then open the door while the second volunteer remains in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. This way, the Blessed Sacrament will not be unattended even for a minute and security will be maintained. Of course more than two volunteers per hour is perfectly fine, and if your availability is limited, please volunteer when you can. However, we do want to ensure that each hour is covered by at least two volunteers. A sign-up sheet is in the vestibule. Thank you.

To receive Holy Communion:

To receive Holy Communion, you must be a baptized Catholic in a state of grace, having made a good confession since your last mortal sin. You must believe in Transubstantiation and observe a one-hour Eucharistic fast, with recommended abstinence from food and alcohol for three hours prior. Public sinners or those excommunicated are not permitted to receive Communion. A sincere desire to receive Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity is essential. You may approach the Communion rail after the priest's Communion, extending your tongue smoothly and horizontally. There's no obligation to receive daily, but strive to be in a state to do so (St. Augustin).

Guest and Visitor Information

Out of respect for Our Lord Jesus Christ and for the edification of our neighbor, we beg all to appear in Church decent in deportment and modest in dress. However, no one has the right to question others, especially visitors. It belongs to the parish priest alone to instruct the laity when they repeatedly dress or deport below expectation. **For gentlemen and lads:** Neither shorts, T-shirts nor sneakers meet the norms of modesty. **For ladies and girls:** Neither shorts, slacks, sleeveless, short nor low-cut dresses meet the norms of modesty. Furthermore, according to apostolic custom or Church law, gentlemen are bareheaded in church; and ladies are requested to cover their heads. Thank you for your charity.
