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News and Announcements

Today is the First Sunday of Advent. It is the first day of the liturgical year. Today Mother Church commences to contemplate the coming of the Redeemer, and with the prophets to long for Him. During the entire season of Advent the Church unites her prayers with their sighs, in order to awaken in her children the desire for the grace of the Redeemer; above all, to move them to true penance for their sins, because these are the greatest obstacles in the path of that gracious Advent.

- * **Today's Second Collection** will be taken up for the **building fund**.
- * **December 5th there will be a special collection for the SSPX Foreign Mission Program** that helps fund the various SSPX missions in Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, South America, Mexico, and others to operate their apostolates.
- * The renewal of the **Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary** according to the method of St. Louis-Marie de Montfort **will take place on December 8th**.

St. Andrew was both an apostle and martyr. After the coming of the Holy Ghost, he preached in Palestine, and then in Scythia, Epirus, and Thrace. The priests of Achaia describe his martyrdom at Patras where he died on a special form of cross which has ever since been called after him. His body, having been first taken to Constantinople, was in 1210 moved to the Cathedral at Amalfi, in the kingdom of Naples. In 1462 his head was placed by Pius II in the basilica of St. Peter, his brother. St. Andrew is the patron of Scotland and his feast has been kept since the fourth century on November 30th. Let us, with St. Andrew, follow Christ even to the cross.

St. Francis Xavier was born near Pamplona in the Basque area of Spanish Navarre on Apr. 7, 1506. He was sent to the University of Paris 1525, secured his licentiate in 1528, met St. Ignatius Loyola and became one of the seven who in 1534, at Montmartre founded the Society of Jesus. St. Francis preached in Mozambique, India, Malacca, New Guinea and Japan. In 1552 he set out for China, landed on the island of Sancian within sight of his goal, but died before he reached the mainland. He was canonized in 1622 and proclaimed Patron of All Foreign Missions by Pope St. Pius X.



ON OUR OBLIGATIONS TO LOVE JESUS CHRIST by St. Alphonsus Liguori (4)



“We have,” says St. Lawrence Justinian, “seen wisdom become foolish through an excess of love.” We have, he says, seen the Son of God become as it were a fool, through the excessive love which he bore to men. Such, too, was the language of the Gentiles when they heard the apostles preaching that Jesus Christ suffered death for the love of men. “But we,” says St. Paul, “preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews indeed a stumbling block, unto the Gentiles foolishness.” (1 Corinthians 1:23) Who, they exclaimed, can believe that a God, most happy in himself, and who stands in need of no one, should take human flesh and die for the love of men, who are his creatures? This would be to believe that a God became foolish for the love of men. “It appears folly,” says St. Gregory, “that the author of Life should die for men.” But, whatever infidels may say or think, it is of faith that the Son of God has shed all his blood for the love of us, to wash away the sins of our souls. “Who hath loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood.” (Apocalypse 1:5) Hence, the saints were struck dumb with astonishment at the consideration of the love of Jesus Christ. At the sight of the crucifix, St. Francis de Paul could do nothing but exclaim, love! love! love!



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To receive Holy Communion :

- You must be a **baptized Catholic**, having made a good confession since the last committed mortal sin - if any - in order to hopefully be **in the state of Grace**.
- You must believe in the doctrine of **Transubstantiation**. “*For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself*” (1 Cor. 11:29).
- You must observe one hour of **Eucharistic fast** (*except water and medicine. However, we advise to abstain from food and alcohol for three hours and one hour for other liquid before Holy Communion*).
- One must not be a **public sinner** (*public adulterer, concubine, public homosexual*), or excommunicated, or interdicted.

- **The most important requirement** is to have a **great desire** to receive the Body, the Blood, the Soul and the Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. You can humbly approach the Communion rail at any time after the Communion of the priest. Then, open your mouth wide and extend smoothly and horizontally your tongue. There is **no special order**, so that nobody should feel compelled to follow a general movement. Do not judge your neighbor who abstains from receiving Holy Communion, as there is no obligation to receive it daily. However, “*Live in a manner to be able to receive communion every day!*” (St. Augustine)
- In this Church, the faculty to absolve sins is directly granted to the priests by the Holy Father.

“I urge you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship.” Rm 12:1

Out of respect for Our Lord Jesus Christ and for the edification of our neighbor, we beg all to appear in Church decent in deportment and modest in dress.

However, no one has the right to question others, especially visitors. It belongs to the parish priest alone to instruct the laity when they repeatedly dress or deport below expectation.

For gentlemen and lads: Neither shorts, T-shirts nor sneakers meet the norms of modesty.

For ladies and girls: Neither shorts, slacks, sleeveless, short nor low-cut dresses meet the norms of modesty.

Furthermore, according to apostolic custom or Church law, gentlemen are bareheaded in church; and ladies are requested to cover their heads.
